ASSESSMENTS & ACCOUNTABILITY ARE NECESSARY



Our state's assessments and accountability system is needed to provide clarity about **expectations, incentivize adults** to meet those expectations, **measure progress**, and **transparently report** whether goals were met.



Texas spends \$60B+ annually on our PK-12 education system, and our system of assessments and accountability is the **best way to measure the return on that investment** due to its comparability and reliability that allows year-over-year comparisons.

ASSESSMENTS & ACCOUNTABILITY WORK

Students on A- and B- rated campuses are:

2x

as likely to meet **grade-level reading** expectations

3x

as likely to be **college ready** upon graduation

2x

as likely to receive **a PS credential** within 6 years

than students on C, D, or F campuses.¹

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
